Advanced Level

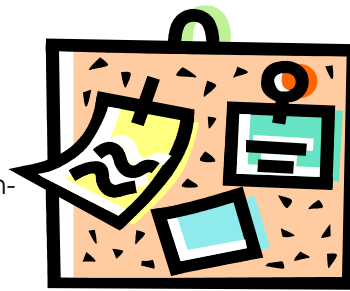
We will continue working with geometry, measurement and data. After concluding this unit, we will move into representing and comparing fractions.

Students will be able to locate the regions where American Indians settled in North America: Arctic, Northwest, Southwest, Plains, Northeast, and Southeast. Students will compare and contrast how American Indians in each region used their environment to obtain food, clothing, and shelter.
